

Outings

Outings enrich children's learning and are planned carefully so that children remain safe and included.

Planning an outing

- A written risk assessment considers travel, supervision, accessibility, weather, toilets, first aid, allergies, medication and emergency arrangements.
- Parents receive information and any consent required.
- Staffing is based on the children, activity and identified risks, not ratios alone.
- A qualified paediatric first aider and suitable first-aid supplies accompany the group.

During the outing

- Registers, regular headcounts and name-to-face checks are completed.
- Children wear appropriate identification without displaying unnecessary personal information.
- Emergency contacts, essential medication and a nursery phone are available.
- Children are supervised closely during travel, road crossing and transitions.

Vehicles and volunteers

Any transport used must be suitable, insured and fitted with appropriate restraints. Volunteers are supervised, included in the risk assessment and never left in sole charge of children unless fully checked and authorised.

Changes or cancellation

We may alter or cancel an outing if staffing, weather, transport, illness or another risk makes it unsafe.
